Classroom Prayer Areas

Your prayer area cloth should still be green until Ash Wednesday. Put the word Alleluia in a box or bury it outside to indicate that we do not use this word during Lent.

For Lent, you could strip back your Prayer focus to just a purple cloth and add items each week related to Sunday's Gospel.

6th March (Ash Wednesday) - Bowl of ashes/dirt to remind us of the ashes we receive.

11th March - Stones/Sand - To represent the temptation in the desert.

18th March - Speech bubbles of 'This is my Son, the chosen One, Listen to him.' / Picture of three tents / Light Bulb - To represent the Transfiguration.

25th March - A small plant to represent nurture just as the fig tree needed to be nurtured.

1st April - Pictures of the father and son embracing from 'The Prodigal Son' to remind us of God's love and mercy for us.

8th April - During the last week of school, you could tell the Holy Week story with items such as palms, money and crown of thorns prayer focus built up over time.

Lent in a Bag

In order to stimulate discussion and deeper understanding of Lent at home, you could create family share bags. You could include;

- Sand** - Place sand within a sandwich bag. 'Jesus between his baptism and the beginning of his ministry went into the wilderness for 40 days to be 'tested'. What do you find difficult in your life? How might you overcome these difficulties?
- Rock** - In the wilderness, Jesus was invited to turn stone into bread. He didn't do this there and then, however, in his ministry he was renowned for feeding people who were hungry for food, for love or for a word of gentle encouragement.
- Human Figure** - Jesus was made fully human and understands how we think and feel. What will you make a conscious effort to do this Lent to make the world a better place for others?
- Candle** - Jesus, according to John's Gospel is 'The Light of the World'. Where do you shine? How do you keep your light lit?
